MINISTER'S MUSINGS

I knew a women once who was a member of a church I served. She was a counselor, a wife, a mother, a yuppie (we used to call them) - practically perfect in every way. She attended Sunday School. She was there weekly, Bible in hand.

I asked her once about why her children didn't come with her. Her response was, "I don't want to pressure them into coming to church. They can decide for themselves about God when they are adults."

Now mind you, she sent those kids to soccer camps, basketball camps, piano lessons, mock trial events, and horseback riding lessons. Those activities couldn't wait until they were adults. The training had to be there when they were young.

It seemed that she felt somewhat noble about her stand. Perhaps seeking assurance that some day her children will not come back to her and say, "you made me go to church and now that I can choose, I won't ever go back!" To my knowledge neither child, both grown now, have ever set foot in the church door. In fact, I heard recently one is divorced, two years after he married. The other bounces from job to job with no real direction in life.

I knew another woman in the church I currently serve. She too was a devote mother and a loving housewife. She attended Sunday School and church faithfully.

Only whenever she was at church her children were right by her side. They helped her cut out craft patterns before Children's Church, attended Sunday School and youth programs, and sang in the children's choir. I don't know for sure, I never asked her, but my guess is that her kids didn't have much choice in the matter.

A week ago Monday, that young mother entered the eternal peace that God has prepared for us through his Son, Jesus Christ - her daughters were by her side. Few in the church were surprised when they both showed up at church the following Sunday.

I am not in favor of forcing a child to go to church per se, but I seriously question the lack of parental encouragement and influence toward the church that some parents seem to adopt.

Believe me, folks, whether or not you provide some sort of influence, your child will be pressured these days - pressured to try drugs, to cheat on tests, to drink, to have premarital sex, even to make a total commitment to athletic teams, musical groups, or other activities all of which will dictate when and where and how often your child is to be present (including Sundays).

The wrong kind of pressure can crush you,, The right kind of pressure can turn coal into diamonds. I know two gem-like, young girls who are going to turn out just find.
